Dr Maureen Reusche, Superintendent

Dr Laura Crispin – Will have a Lynnwood Kindergartener in the fall, was elected in November of 2019. She is a professor of economics at St Joe's University and is very passionate with the public-school system.

Dave Schwarz – elected in November 2019. Oversaw the facilities project at Lynnwood. He has a 9th grader and a son going into Kindergarten. He has a engineering background and a planning coordinator.

Larry Feinberg comments:

- Update on the schools is an investment on our community, there will be an adding of 400 kids to the H.S. with an addition to 12 more classrooms which should be done in a year and a half
- Looking at updating the ventilator systems at Cooperstown and Chatham Park
- We have all been consumed by the pandemic.
- Mr Feinberg and Ms Wiedeman met with other school districts in the area to discuss the challenges they have all been facing.
- Mr Feinberg has been a resident in Haverford Township for 30 years and the demographic has really changed.

- End of year activities we are being mindful of social distancing
- Haverford On Line still revamping up and we have had it in the district for over 10 years.

- Any changes to bus schedule please reach out to transportation
